## INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE 2002 WEEKLY LOGBOOK FORMS

### COMPLETE LOGBOOKS DAILY.

During the period April 22-September 29, 2002, once a vessel has been used for charter fishing, the logbook must be completed daily (including inactive days) through the last trip of the season. It is **not** necessary to start logbook entries until the vessel is actually used for a charter fishing trip during 2002.

The owner or agent of the business operating this vessel is **required** to make an entry into this logbook per the following schedule.

#### RETURNING TO A DOCK

- **FISH KEPT**  
Complete the logbook before offloading any clients **or** fish.
  - **NO FISH KEPT**  
Complete the logbook before the operator leaves the vessel.
- NO DOCKING FACILITIES (e.g., trailered vessels)**
- **FISH KEPT**  
Complete the logbook before the vessel **or** operator departs the landing site **and** before offloading any fish.
  - **NO FISH KEPT**  
Complete the logbook before the vessel **or** operator departs the landing site.

#### **MULTIPLE TRIPS PER DAY**

Complete the logbook at the end of each trip, as described above.

#### **MULTIPLE DAY TRIPS**

Complete the logbook at day's end for each day of the trip; complete the last day's activity as described above.

#### **PERIODS OF INACTIVITY**

Once a vessel has been used for a charter trip between April 22 - Sept 29, 2002, the logbook must be completed daily to report inactivity or fishing trips. A logbook sheet must be submitted weekly, even if no trips were taken for the entire week. Trips taken before April 22 and after Sept 29, 2002 should be recorded on the Supplemental sheets provided in the logbook.

Please be complete and write legibly. You may be contacted in person or by mail if forms are delinquent, missing, incomplete, or illegible.

### RETURN LOGBOOK REPORTS WEEKLY.

Once a vessel has been used for a charter fishing trip, the logbook **must** be completed **daily** and returned per the schedule printed on each logbook sheet until a sheet is submitted indicating that the vessel has taken its last trip for the year. Logbook sheets **must be received** by ADF&G offices or postmarked by the date specified on each logbook sheet.

### WEEKLY & SUPPLEMENTAL SHEETS.

**Weekly Logbook Sheets** should be used to report charter fishing trips and inactive days between April 22 and September 29, 2002.

**Supplemental Logbook Sheets** should be used to report charter fishing activity before April 22 or after September 29, or to report trips in addition to the first two trips taken on any day.

**Supplemental Logbook Sheets** used prior to April 22 should be postmarked by May 6.

**Supplemental Logbook Sheets** used after April 22 should be submitted when a form is full or when you are through fishing for the season (whichever comes first).

**Supplemental Logbook Sheets** may be adapted to special needs. For example, two trips are taken in a day, then the vessel departs on a multi-day trip. Use the **Supplemental Form** to report the first day of the multi-day trip.

Additional **Supplemental Logbooks Sheets** beyond the five in this logbook are available from local ADF&G offices.

### CERTIFICATION SIGNATURE DEADLINE

Each **Weekly Logbook Sheet** and each **Supplemental Logbook Sheet** **must** be legibly signed and dated by the owner or agent of the business operating the vessel to which the logbook has been assigned.

**Any 2002 logbook sheets received after January 15, 2003 will not be entered into the ADF&G 2002 logbook database nor counted towards a vessel's total.**

### LOGBOOK DATA.

<b>ADF&amp;G No.</b>	The 5-digit vessel number assigned by the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission (CFEC). A vessel must have a number plate and current license tab securely fastened to the port side of the vessel.
<b>Vessel Name</b>	The Vessel Name or identity, as it corresponds to the ADF&G No. issued by the CFEC.
<b>Date</b>	Dates are printed on the weekly sheets from April 22 through September 29. You must write the date on <b>Supplemental Logbook Sheets</b> .
<b>Inactive (X):</b>	Check <b>Inactive</b> if the vessel is not used for charter fishing on a given date.
<b>Trip No.</b>	A <b>Trip</b> starts when the vessel leaves a dock, port, or launch site with clients on board to go sport fishing. A trip typically ends when the vessel returns to a dock, port, or site of landing to offload clients and fish. A trip may cover part of one day, one day, or multiple days.  DO NOT sum information for two or more trips; each trip must be reported separately in the Logbook.  The first two trips on a day should be reported on the <b>Weekly Logbook Sheets</b> ; all additional trips for the day would be reported in the <b>Supplemental Logbook Sheets</b> .  Write the date and trip number on the <b>Supplemental Logbook Sheet</b> .
<b>Day No. of Multi-day trip</b>	This applies to trips that span two or more calendar days (see definition of <b>Trip</b> above). A "1" would be entered for the first day of a trip, "2" would be written for the second day, and so on until the trip is completed.
<b>Port of Landing</b>	The port (or site) where clients and/or fish are offloaded at the conclusion of the trip.
<b>Number of Clients and Crew Fishing</b>	The number of clients and crew who fished any part of the trip, whether or not they landed a fish. If crew do not fish, leave crew blank. DO NOT add crew information to client information.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE 2002 WEEKLY LOGBOOK FORMS

### LOGBOOK DATA (CONTINUED).

#### SALMON

<b>Primary Stat Area Fished</b>	The 6-digit area code where you caught most of the salmon on this trip. If you fished for salmon, but caught none, write the code for the location fished the most time on this date and trip.
<b>Maximum Rods Fished</b>	The maximum number of rods/lines fished when targeting salmon and targeting both salmon and bottomfish (incl. halibut) simultaneously. Record this information separately for clients and crew; DO NOT combine client and crew information.
<b>No. Boat Hours Fished</b>	The number of boat hours at least one rod/line was targeting salmon and targeting salmon and bottomfish (incl. halibut) simultaneously. Record only number of hours spent fishing, NOT hours spent running to or from fishing areas. Round to the nearest whole hour.
<b>Fish Kept &amp; Released</b>	The total number of fish kept and released by client and crew as indicated. DO NOT combine client and crew information.

#### BOTTOMFISH

<b>Primary Stat Area Fished</b>	The 6-digit area code where you caught most of the bottomfish on this trip. If you fished for bottomfish, but caught none, write the code for the location fished the most time on this date and trip.
<b>Maximum Rods Fished</b>	The maximum number of rods/lines fished when targeting bottomfish (incl. halibut) and targeting both salmon and bottomfish simultaneously. Record this information separately for clients and crew; DO NOT combine client and crew information.
<b>No. Boat Hours Fished</b>	The number of boat hours that at least one rod/line was targeting bottomfish (incl. halibut) and targeting salmon and bottomfish simultaneously. Record only number of hours spent fishing, NOT hours spent running to or from fishing areas. Round to the nearest whole hour.
<b>Fish Kept &amp; Released</b>	The total number of fish kept and released by client and crew as indicated. DO NOT combine client and crew information. DO NOT record harvests of finfish other than those indicated. Halibut information is no longer being collected in logbooks. This information is collected through established survey programs.

### SPECIAL NOTES—RODS, BOAT HOURS.

An operator must decide if gear and fishing methods were effectively targeting salmon, bottomfish, or both species groups.

After completing the first five columns, record the maximum number of rods and number of boat hours in the appropriate columns in the salmon section, even if no salmon were caught or kept.

NOTE: If bottomfish are caught when targeting salmon only, record the number of bottomfish in the appropriate columns in the bottomfish section, but leave columns for maximum number of rods and boat hours fished in the bottomfish section blank—DO NOT record information in these columns.

After completing the first five columns, record the maximum number of rods and number of boat hours in the appropriate columns in the bottomfish section, even if no bottomfish were caught or kept.

NOTE: If salmon are caught when targeting bottomfish only, record the number of salmon in the appropriate kept/released columns in the salmon section, but leave columns for maximum number of rods and boat hours fished in the salmon section blank—DO NOT record information in these columns.

After completing the first five columns, record the maximum number of rods and boat hours spent fishing simultaneously for salmon and bottomfish in the appropriate columns in BOTH the salmon and bottomfish sections.

For example, if mooching for 4 hours with up to 4 rods, record 4 hours and 4 rods in the salmon effort columns, and 4 hours and 4 rods in the bottomfish effort columns.

After completing the first five columns, record the maximum number of rods and boat hours spent targeting salmon AND targeting both salmon and bottomfish (including halibut) simultaneously in the appropriate columns in the salmon section, and the maximum number of rod and boat hours spent targeting bottomfish AND targeting both salmon and bottomfish simultaneously in the appropriate columns in the bottomfish section.

### SPECIAL NOTES - SPECIES.

**“Shakers”**

Chinook (king) salmon that are under the 28” minimum size (only in the Southeast Region) that must be released upon capture, unless caught in designated terminal harvest areas.

**Pelagic Rockfish**

Includes black and dusky rockfish (commonly called “black bass”) and yellowtail rockfish.

These species of rockfish are uniformly gray, green, brown, or black (see rockfish ID chart in your regulation booklet).

**Non-pelagic Rockfish**

All other rockfish not mentioned above. Includes yelloweye (commonly called “red snapper”), quillback, and copper rockfish, as well as numerous other species.

**Salmon Shark**

This is a single species *Lamna ditropis*. These sharks are large, firm, dark brown or black on top, with white bellies with dark blotches. Do not include spiny dogfish (“sand shark”) or sleeper sharks (“mud sharks”) in this category.

## VIOLATION WARNING

**Failure to comply with any of the above requirements could be grounds for a citation. If you require clarification of logbook requirements, contact your local ADF&G office.**

For overnight charters.

Bottomfish Fishing effort information includes effort targeting halibut.

Record rockfishes only-Do Not record greenlings, sculpins, or any other fishes here.

Note: 1 crew member did not fish for salmon, but did target bottomfish.

Mark each date the vessel was not fishing.

Note: incidental catch of salmon (not a target so rods and boat hours are not recorded).

Note: Crew did not fish; each client fished for salmon and bottomfish.

Record salmon sharks only, no other shark species should be recorded. Spiny dogfish or sleeper sharks should not be recorded here.

Note: All clients targeted both salmon and bottomfish for the entire trip. This could occur if a technique targets both species groups (e.g., "mooching").

Remember to mark the first and last trips of the season.


